Background:

Music, Emotion & Culture

- **Music and Emotion** (Major fast vs. Minor slow)
Beginning with Pythagoras Zentner et al. (2008)
- **Music and Culture** (Experience tunes & emotions)
Laukka, Erola, Thingujam, Yamasaki, and Beller (2013)
- **Immigration and Acculturation Research**
 - interest in the role of music to help with adjustment

Method

- 261 Participants gathered through word of mouth and introductory psychology classes
- Asked to Complete **Music and Cultural Identity Questionnaire**
 - list 5 home songs & 5 Recent songs
 - Rate one of each song on 30 emotion terms ratings: 1 (Not at all) to 5 (Completely)

Results

- Participants organized into one of 8 regions:
Can, USA, Latin America, West Europe,
East Europe, China (Asia), India/Mid-East/Africa
- Ages 13 -59 (mean=21.97)
- Average time in Canada 16.69 years
- 163 Women & 94 Men

Top Home Songs

- **Canada:** 14-“Home” (4-Ed Sharpe, LCD, Kid Ink, Michael Buble, Chantal Kreviazuk); “Coming Home”; “Take me home”; Back Home, Sweet Home Alabama; 4-“Christmas”; 4-“Pink Floyd” 3-“Bob Marley”; 3-“Eagles” 3-“Classical”; The Northwest Passage; 2-“O Canada”; 2“Hello”
- **West Europe:** “Jerusalem”; “Galway Girl”; “Sweet Love”
- **East Europe:** “ne zabivai svikorli”; “eto vse”; “four seasons”; “Stop and Stare”, “Red Wood”; “Menswear”
- **China (Asia):** 4-“Home”; “Let me go Home”; 2-“National Song of China; “Hong Kong Place”; “Heikei Juugo no Kimi e”; “Nada sou sou”; “Talking to the Moon”; Mozart Sonata K 448; Closer.

Top Home Songs

- **USA:**

“Hotel California” ; “It is you”; “I'm a Believer”;
“If You're Gone”; “Rocky Mountain High”

- **Latin America:**

“darle la vuelta al mundo”; “Mexico lindo y quendo”; “One Love”; “Beautiful Soul”; “Umbrella”

- **India/ME/Africa:**

“Faghti miyao”; “Home (Phillips)”; “Coming Home”; “Bohemiam Rhapsody”; “Feelings are weapons”; “Unwritten”; “You and I”;

Part II: Stress & Musical Emotions

- 123 of these participants also completed the **BPSHI-r**
(Stress measure designed for international students)
- **Provides several scores:**
Total Stress, Biological Stress, Psychological stress, Social Stress, Current Stress & Positive Adjustment.
- Compared Stress and Emotion ratings for Home songs

Discussion & Summary

- A great diversity of music gives us a sense of home
- In general songs of “Home” make us feel **nostalgic, happy, joyful** and **passionate** and not despair, anxious, upset or agitated.
- Some cultural differences observed in **Nostalgia, Pride, Spiritual & Shivers/Thrilled** as well as **Upset, Agitated, Anxious & Melancholic**.
- Some gender differences were also found with Males more **energized**, Females more **longing** and **nostalgic**.
- Those rating home music more negatively also appear to experience more **psychological and social stress**.

Future Directions

- Continue to enlarge sample making it a **more global assessment** of emotions of music of home.
- **Play musical selections** from “Home” and measure physiological and subjective emotional reactions.
- **Use music in therapeutic fashion** for helping to deal with acculturation and stress.
